ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm at the Pemberville Public Library. SECRETARY'SMINUTES: Ron made and Amber seconded a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. All ayes recorded.

FISCAL OFFICER'S STATEMENTS: The monthly allocations were Gross \$37,878.16 minus Woodlink \$1,525.83 with a Net of \$35,764.37. Sharon made and Mary Jo seconded a motion to approve the Estimated Resources. All ayes recorded. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

TREE REMOVAL AT LUCKEY: A sycamore tree is rotten at the base and close to power lines. The Chief of Police will reach out to Beeker's Landscaping for a quote to remove.

DIRT PILE AT LUCKEY: The dirt pile near the walkway has been removed. Lisa Skriba (Garden Club President) and Chief Bielinski got rid of it. Ariel made a batch of cookies as a thank you.

LIGHT COVERS AT STONY RIDGE: Light covers at Stony Ridge are falling from the ceiling at irregular intervals and pose a safety hazard. Some are repairable; most are not. Grainger has been contacted to see if covers like this are still available and the cost.

SERVING EVERY OHIOAN (SEO) DIRECTOR'S MEETING: This was the first in-person meeting since 2019. Patron Point (newsletter software) has been updated and Ariel is intending to use this service but needs to complete training for it. There is also a possibility that SEO may migrate to a new

software system in 2026 or 2027. OPLIN demonstrated website services comparable to what we pay for that service through NORWELD. If we join there will be a one-time fee for building the website along with a yearly maintenance fee. Cargo fees will increase by 3 percent July 1 of next year.

FRONT RESTROOM AT LUCKEY: Panels of the front restroom's sink fell off. There was very little glue holding them. The panels were reattached.

The Board would like to see what the boxes look like and review the condition of them after five years. The Board also wants to approve the location of the boxes. Mary Jo and Steve offered to sit down with the Scout to review the boxes and approve the locations of the boxes. John made and Mary Jo seconded a motion to generally approve the scope of the project.
